Not to mention Paris' tourist hotspots, such as the environments of the Notre Dame, the Eiffel Tower, the Champs Élysées and the banks of the Seine. All these places are being redeveloped and given a green makeover.

In this <u>publication</u>, we dive into more than 50 projects and take stock. We speak with ecologists, landscape designers and many other experts who are contributing to this operation. 


